Content

Lectures: Characteristics of quality of life of persons with intellectual disability; Assessing the need for support; Determination of individual support profile intensity; Models of individually oriented and family-oriented planning of support; Co-operation strategies of experts and services that need to provide the support; Strategy for developing individual support programs, models of implementation and evaluation.

Practical work: Practical exercises include assessment of individual need for support, defining individual programs, as well as application of optimal activities in application of these programs.
